House of Representatives Amendment to House Bill 2293

The amendment addresses only Innovative Schools. A petition and innovative plan for the Innovative School must be approved by 50% of the families of the students enrolled in a chronically at-risk of failing school. The process of establishing the Innovative School, local management boards, employment of personnel, financial requirements, and requirements for adequate yearly progress are outlined in the amendment. The Department of Education may approve up to 12 Innovative Schools within a period of 6 years beginning July 2010.
