

The Pascagoula School District's Family Interactive Center opened recently in the heart of the city on Market Street. It is located in the building that formerly housed Carver High School.



This center was created as a place where families could go to learn and play together.



The building has been refurbished to include a technology wing featuring three computer labs which can be used for teaching training, workshops, and curriculum writing for teachers in addition to parent and student activities.



The Applied Technology Center's carpentry students constructed a wooden train outside the building complete with engine and boxcars for the children to play and learn about trains. Some of the learning opportunities include a planetarium, wetlands room, block room, science and engineering room and broadcast studio.



The school district partnered with Chevron, Northrop Grumman Shipbuilding, Mississippi Power Foundation, Bacot-McCarty Foundation, Pascagoula Rotary Club, Pascagoula-Moss Point Junior Auxiliary, Lyons, Pipes and Cook Law Firm, Stewart Construction, and the Jackson County Board of Supervisors to furnish the resources for each room.
